



### Most Voters View Trade/Technical Colleges Favorably




#### When Asked About Education Value, Trade/Technical Colleges Rise to the Top



#### 64% of Voters Think Colleges Should Focus More on Trade Skills


# Most Voters Want Colleges to Focus More on Trade Skills, Agriculture, and STEM

#### Voters Are Split on Whether a College Degree Benefits Outweigh Its Costs




#### **Voters Across Party Lines Think Attending College Has Become Too Expensive**

### **Key Takeaways**

- Voters have a very positive opinion of trade/technical colleges, and a strong majority support increased federal funding for trade schools and increased focus on trade skills.
- Voters generally think all higher education institutions offer education value, and they think trade/technical colleges (85%) offer the highest value.
- However, voters are split on whether the cost of a college degree is worth it in general, as an overwhelming majority think it's become too expensive.
- Just over half of voters (54%) think colleges and universities are effective at helping students secure a well-paying job.
